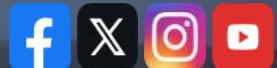

Prior to being selected in 2009 as the choir's 2nd conductor, she was both a choir member and soprano soloist. Kelly's masterful conducting style and creativity define The Colorado Choir's sound.

Hailing from Centennial, **Andrew Fischer** is a pianist and singer who discovered the joy of music early in public schools through participation in both choirs and orchestras. Recently he was brought on as the resident music director at the Performing Arts Academy in Centennial. In between, he offers private music lessons to students in the area.
